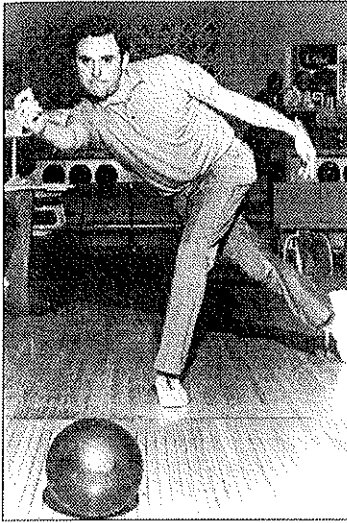

Phil Prieto

Bowling



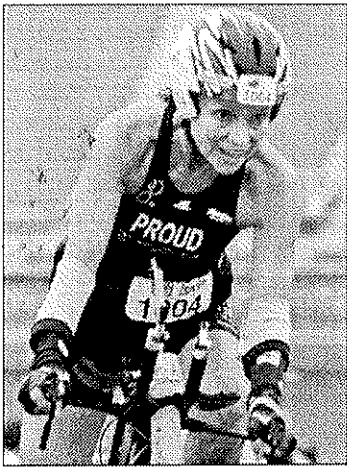
Phil Prieto disproves the adage "Nice guys finish last." Born in Temple, Texas, he has called El Paso home since he was three. Phil's excellence on the lanes was obvious from an early age, and by the time he was twenty he qualified for his Professional Bowlers' Association card. Phil has rolled nineteen 300 games and six 800 series. In 1985 he had an 876 series which was the highest score in the nation that year, a Texas record until just a few years ago, and still an El Paso record. During a career of

competing at the highest levels through five decades, Phil has recorded seven PBA regional titles, five Senior All Star BA titles, three Texas State championships, and the El Paso 1969 All Events and 2011 Doubles titles. Competing internationally (including being on Team USA), Phil harvested four Golds, four Silvers and three Bronze medals. In 1985, Phil and three others opened Bowl El Paso, the showplace of bowling in the Southwest. In 23 years as proprietor, Bowl El Paso hosted five PBA

National Tour stops, eight Regional PBA tournaments, and two Texas State tournaments. Along with his bowling involvement, Phil served in the U.S. Medical Corps and had a physical therapy practice for thirty years. In this vein, he assisted UTEP with computerized strength testing of athletes. Phil is married to Janis Blades Prieto, who is also a member of the El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame (1983); father of Bryan and Brody (deceased of ALS); and grandfather of four.

Diane Proud

Triathlete



Diane Proud was not athletic until her late 20's. She entered her first 10K race in El Paso in 1978, then joined the Half Fast Track Club and ran various distances, including marathons. In 1982, an injury sidelined her from running so she swam and bicycled to cross train, discovering she was an even better multi-sport competitor than single sport athlete.

She became an 8-time USA Triathlon All-American, represented the US in more than 20 ITU World Championship Triathlons, Duathlons and Aquathlons. She won ITU World Duathlon Championship, silver and bronze medals,

an ITU World Triathlon Championship bronze medal, two ITU World Aquathon gold medals, two National Triathlon titles, two National Duathlon titles, a National Winter Triathlon gold medal and a National X-Terra off-road USA Championship bronze medal.

Diane is a three-time National Grand Masters Female Duathlete of the Year, and won Honorable Mention as 2006 National Grand Masters Triathlete of the Year. She completed two Ironman Championships and placed 3rd in her age group in Ironman New Zealand. She received the 2009 Southwest Challenge

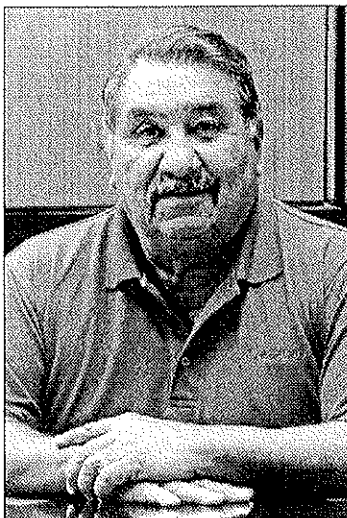
Series Sportsmanship Award in El Paso and the 2009 Dallas White Rock Marathon Spirit Award.

Diane and Bob have been married for 32 years with one son, James. She owns Proud Performance, is a certified USA Triathlon Coach and holds Elite Certifications from the Cooper Institute. She conducts water running clinics, kids running and triathlon camps.

In early 2009, Diane was diagnosed with the bulbar form ALS. Her friends honor her with the Run Proud for Dessert 5k to raise money and awareness of ALS.

Pete Solis, Jr.

Multisport



Pete Solis's intense competitive spirit and commitment to excellence extend to Auto Racing, Boxing, Baseball, Basketball, Football, Softball, Wrestling and Golf.

Pete graduated Jefferson High in 1964. He captained the football team, made All-District in baseball on a district championship team, and found time to play Junior Varsity Basketball. He wrestled, and was the School Boxing Champion in 1960.

Pete's Men's Fast Pitch Softball team, the Jesters, captured the City Championship in 1976 and was a traveling highlight reel of championships capturing tourney

titles in Albuquerque, Tucson, and Austin.

Pete participated in the Boys and Girls Clubs of El Paso Midget Gloves Program and later won the El Paso Golden Gloves Middleweight Crown in 1966, 1968 and 1969 with the famed Fox Plaza Barber Shop team. He represented El Paso in three State Boxing Tournaments, and was inducted into the El Paso Boxing Hall of Fame (2000).

From 1968-1973 Pete drove a 1957 Chevrolet named Apollo 11, competing in many international races in Mexico, winning 7 auto racing championships.

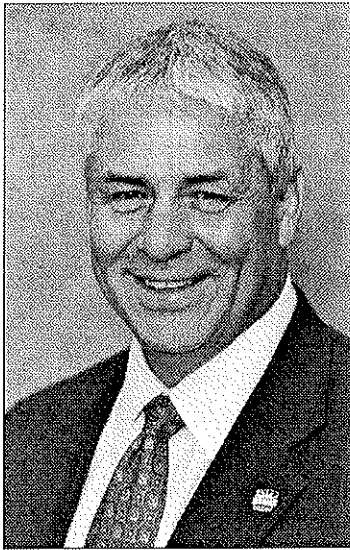
Pete still plays competitive golf today. Through the charitable

efforts of Rudolph Chevrolet, he has organized the Rudolph/Jean Neesen Invitational Golf Tournament for the last 22 years, while being actively involved in sponsoring Junior Golf Youth Programs. He has won the Ascarate Golf Club Championship twice, and was a three-time champion of the PGA Club Championship (2003, 2004, 2005), while also placing 10th in the 2000 Pan American Golf Nationals in Phoenix and in the Top 20 five different times at the Pan American Golf Nationals.

Pete Solis has been married to Jenny for 31 years and has one daughter, Joanna.

Bernie Olivas

Administrator/Coach



El Paso native Bernie Olivas earned 11 varsity letters at Cathedral High School and was 1971 Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Bernie was awarded a football scholarship to the University of Texas at El Paso and earned a bachelor's degree in health sciences from UTEP in 1976.

After graduating, he went on to coach football, baseball and basketball at Cathedral. He restarted the dormant baseball program at his alma mater and guided the Irish to the back-to-back TCIL State Final appearances in boys basketball in 1980 and 1981.

Bernie has developed a love and a passion for his work like no other. Olivas is the executive director of the Sun Bowl Association, a position that he has held since 2001. He oversees almost 25 special events, including the Hyundai Sun Bowl, the Bank of the West Don Haskins Sun Bowl Invitational, the Western Refining College All-America Golf Classic and the Academy Sports & Outdoors Sun Bowl International Soccer Tournament.

The Sun Bowl Association produces the largest economic impact in El Paso for a single

event with the annual Sun Bowl football game. Four of the five largest crowds in Sun Bowl history have come under his watch, including the record 54,021 fans for last year's game between Notre Dame and Miami.

Olivas, who was a Sun Bowl volunteer for over 20 years, served as the 2000 Sun Bowl Association President--the 66th president in Sun Bowl history. His involvement with the Sun Bowl began when he joined one of the team host committees, and he was named to the Sun Bowl Board of Directors in 1992.

Jack White

Coach



Jack White was introduced to swimming in 1977 by Leo Cancellare. He was a district and regional champion, a state qualifier at Eastwood High, and a conference champion and Collegiate All American at Henderson State.

His passion and life's work has been coaching swimming. Though quiet and unassuming, Jack has had the ability to turn his young swimmers into champions, creating one of the most impressive records in the history of El Paso high school sports.

In 1985, Jack became an assistant coach with the Aqua

Posse. At 21 years, became the head swim coach at Cathedral High. After losing his first meet to Eastwood in January 1986, the Irish started a winning streak, winning every meet and invitational in El Paso ... for 25 straight years. Under Coach White, Cathedral has compiled a record of 279-1 and has been ranked as El Paso's #1 High School Boys Team 25 consecutive years. Cathedral has won 23 state swimming titles under Jack. He has led Cathedral to the prestigious "Easterns" National Prep and Private School Championship, where they have placed in the

top 10 three times. Since 1988, 24 Cathedral swimmers have been selected to the High School Swimming All American Team.

Jack became the head coach of the Aqua Posse in 1999 and in 2000 took two to the US Olympic Trials. Since 1986, more than 70 Cathedral and Aqua Posse swimmers have been awarded swimming scholarships to universities around the country.

Jack also teaches AP and Dual-Credit History. He lives with his wife Karen and two sons, Hayden and Connor.

Richard Castro

Media/Supporter



Richard Castro was born in Del Rio, Texas in 1948 where his parents and his grandmother instilled the value of hard work. In 1970 he received his Bachelor's degree from Texas State University and by 1983 he was in El Paso, opening his first McDonald's franchise.

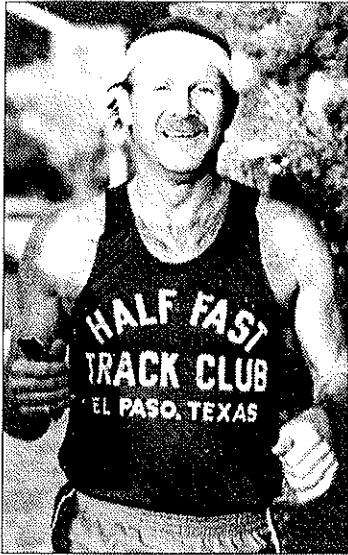
In 1985 Richard founded the RMHC/HACER scholarship program, which provided Hispanic students from the community to attend college. He also helped start and sponsor the McDonald's basketball league, which grew to include both boys and girls in grades 3-12. Between 1990 and 1995

this league was the largest basketball league in the state of Texas. From 1989-1996 Richard also sponsored the girls BCI tournament, allowing girls of all ages to experience basketball at a national level. He helped start and sponsor the McDonald's volleyball league at Bowie J.S. in 1990 and endorsed and sponsored the McDonald's High School Basketball-Volleyball Showcase. This event served as a way for many high school seniors to be showcased in their final high school game. From 1994-2003 he supported the Midnight Basketball Program,

that kept kids off the streets and gave them a sense of pride as they competed on the basketball court. In 2008, he created the McDonalds Basketball Classic giving local high schools the opportunity to play against ranked teams from around the state.

Richard Castro's true passion runs deeper than any game. He loves working with the youth of El Paso and he believes that one can never do enough to help the youth--the more people get involved with helping kids with education, the more viable our community is going to be.

Norman Pittenger
Posthumous



Norman W. Pittenger graduated with honors from Texas Western College in 1958, married Carol in 1960 and had two sons, Mark and Garret. He was considered the "Father of Running" in El Paso. He did not run from life, he ran for life. He did not run from El Paso, he ran for El Paso.

He was a YMCA "Run for Your Life" honoree, an El Paso "Ambassador of Running" and a founder of the Half Fast Track Club, now called Run El Paso. He ran in more than 20 Texas cities and 20 New

Mexico cities. He ran in Colorado, Louisiana, Arizona, California, Utah, Illinois, Massachusetts and New York. He ran more than 30 marathons, including Boston six times and New York twice, with many months and miles of preparation.

In 1997 he set a goal to be the first person to run a marathon on all 7 of the world's continents in one calendar year...and he did it in only 9 months! He ran in Europe, North America, Antarctica, South America, Asia, and Australia and Africa, where he

raised money to help World Runners in their campaign for a world without hunger.

His favorite running areas around El Paso included White Sands, Juarez and Mt. Cristo Rey. In 2001, a race to the top of Mt. Cristo Rey was named in his memory. He was a shining example of the best in El Paso athletics as he ran 32 years and earned 250 ribbons, 100 plaques, 500 trophies and 100 medals. Norman has now crossed the finish line as a member of the El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame!
